- Information and Support Centre call the National Melanoma Support Line and speak with someone who understands your situation.
- Melanoma Nurse Telehealth Service be supported by a specialist melanoma nurse to navigate the health system, access available services and make decisions regarding your health.
- Support Groups join a support group. Options include digital, Facebook and telephone support groups.
- Peer Support connect with others who share a similar lived experience.
